May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had." **Romans 15:4-5**

Have you ever watched the Disney movie UP? This movie is about an elderly man who goes on a trip to a place where he has never been before, and he has some unexpected travel partners. My homework for you and your family during this time is to please watch it.

One thing that the movie reveals to us is the effects on the elderly man through the challenge of the unfamiliarity of the land and the difficult adjustments for his team, which consists of a cute but unique young boy scout and a dog who can talk!

When you think about what sustained him to continue on the trip, the movie reveals his motivation comes from a sweet and powerful place: the love he has for his belated wife. This love gave him the courage to continue and the strength to endure through many changes.

Strength and Endurance through change...these are the two attributes I am praying for each of us to empower during this time of change in our lives.

I believe if I asked you if you have ever experienced something similar to the effects of COVID-19 in your lifetime, I am almost certain that most of you would not come to anything close to this experience. This is new unfamiliar territory for each of us, with a need for many adjustments. Our current experience is just like the elderly man in the movie Up.

However, just like the elderly man who found a place to anchor his **Strength and Endurance** through change, we have someone to lead us also in this season, and His name is Jesus Christ.

While this is not an easy time, we too have a place where we can find our **Strength and Endurance** to continue, and that place is in the love of the Lord Jesus Christ in our lives. It is through *His love* that we are able to find in Him a supernatural strength and endurance. It is through *His love* that we are equipped with grace by those family members and people that are surrounding us right now. It is through *His love* that we can help our neighbor, who is probably worried and anxious, with our grace and patience at this time. It is through *His love* that we remember that our lives have a value in eternal life, and not in the temporary life changes that we are making right now. It is through *His love* that this time can bring fruit to our lives:

- We will learn to discern with more clarity.
- We will discern what is important from what is a distraction.
- We will discern to value things that we previously took for granted.
- We will discern to love each other with a new perspective.

Life will not be the same, but in Christ, this time will become an opportunity for us to be richer in eternal places.

So my dear NHUMC family: I am praying for you. I am also looking forward to hugging EACH OF YOU the next time when we gather again.

This hymn, that I confess I took for granted for so long, has a new meaning for me: "God be with you Till we meet again"

In my experience the most challenging aspects of Christian life today are competitions. We compete with our own schedules for down time and prayer time. While competition has always been a part of any culture that man exists in, it seems that in today's society these competitions have turned up in severity and have declined in demeanor.

doubt that we would find anyone who does not believe that schedules and attention spans are growing ever more hectic as we progress in a technologically advanced way. Our people seem to be distracted by nuances while at the same time being demanded to produce not only in the workplace but also in the home as well as in extra-curricular activities for themselves or their families. This dual nature puts a sharp contrast to the slow or at least patience requiring disciplines that can actually change our lives. While the eschatological message of Jesus is not difficult to understand, the background and biblical narrative requires some patience to learn. This does not play well into the fast food consumerism that our society seems to value and that our congregants adhere to either begrudgingly or willingly. It is understood that a person gets out of relationship with the church what he or she puts into it; however, that argument only works for those who are already tied into our Christ.



here is also competition for our personal time. It is understood that we should try to be all things to all men; or at least a person needs to be a good family person, in good financial shape, and a spiritually healthy person. These items can compete with each other as well as with the stressful work environment that many employers cultivate. There never seems to be enough hours in the day or enough days in the week to complete all the assignments that are required to continue to maintain a healthy: career, spirit, mind, family, and household. To move in one direction too strongly means taking focus away from other areas that we should not neglect. To focus on the job too much can easily lead to one's family paying a cost that is not permissible. To focus too much on everything but not allow oneself some rest and replenishment will also lead to disaster.

I he real challenge of these competitions is that they must happen. We do our best to build a healthy culture in our homes and lives, but we must reach outside of them in order to reach new growth. Therefore, we must work in a culture that values capitalism, social popularity, and persuasion. These competitions are challenges that must happen; however, we should never let them overtake our spiritual desire to be honest, full of integrity, and healthy. Further, we can realize that rest and rejuvenation is not mandated by our father in heaven. So the real trick might be to compete and surrender at the same time.


